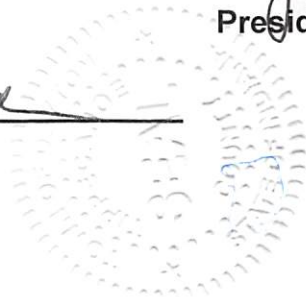
Section 2. That the above described real estate should be and is hereby rezoned from R1U_ to NBU__.

EXHIBIT A

A part of the Northwest Quarter of Section Nine (9) in Township Twenty-two (22) North, Range Three (3) West,

described as follows, to-wit: Beginning one (1) rod South of the southeast corner of lot Six (6) in William Bush First Plat of Dayton, thence South five (5) rods and eight (8) feet; thence West seven (7) rods, four (4) feet and six (6) inches; thence North five (5) rods and eight (8) feet; thence East to the place of beginning, containing one-fourth (1/4) of an acre, more or less.

ALSO part of said Northwest Quarter of said Section, Township and Range described as follows, to-wit: Commencing one hundred and two (102) feet South of the southwest corner of lot three (3) in same Plat; thence South ten and 6/10 (10.6) poles; thence East twenty-six and 42/100 (26.42) poles; thence North 7 1/2 degrees West nine and 70/100 (9.70) poles; thence West twenty-five and 6/100 (25.06) poles to the place of beginning, containing one and 62/100 (1.62) acres, more or less.

ALSO Sixteen and one-half (16 1/2) feet in width laying along the south side of lot numbered Six (6) in said Addition. Located in Sheffield Township, Tippecanoe County, Indiana.
